

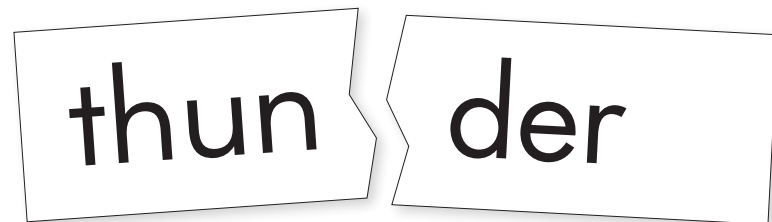
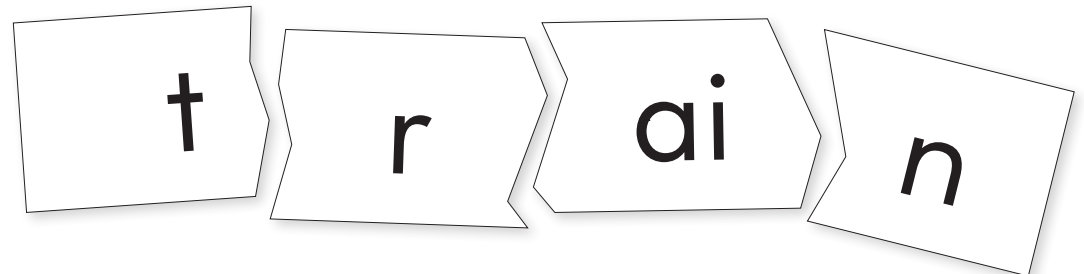
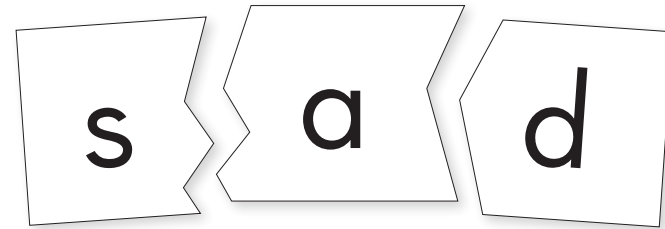

Easily create **Blending Puzzles** by using fillable fields on the following pages of this PDF. Use word lists from the current *Superkids* unit, the *Big Book of Blending*, or the *Big Book of Decoding* to select decodable words with the target letter-sounds (or phonemes). Type one letter-sound on each puzzle piece to create a word puzzle. Once you have created all the puzzles needed, print the appropriate page(s), laminate if desired, and cut out each puzzle.

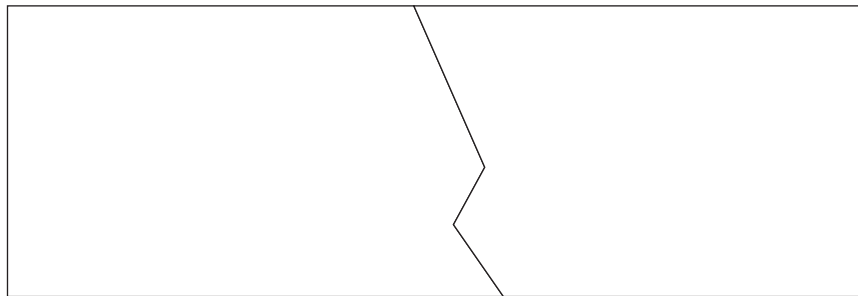
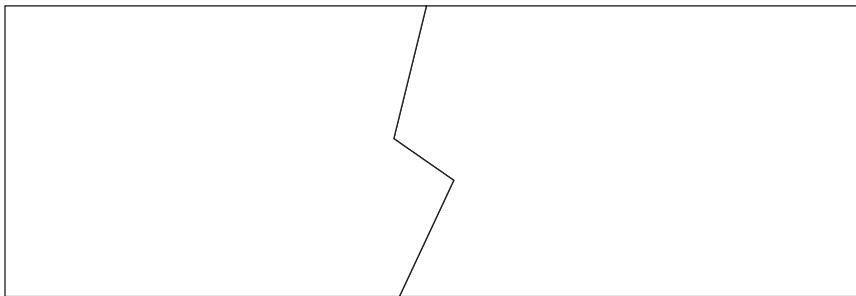
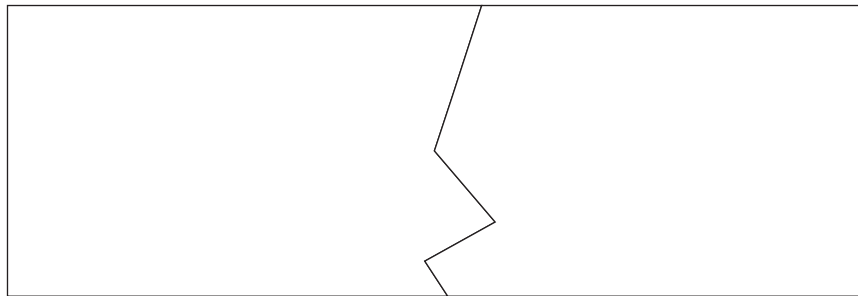
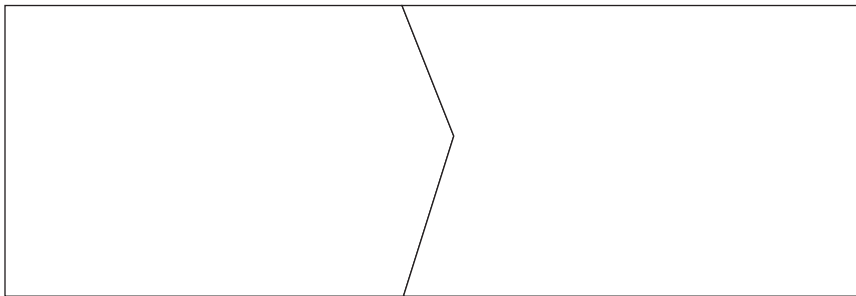
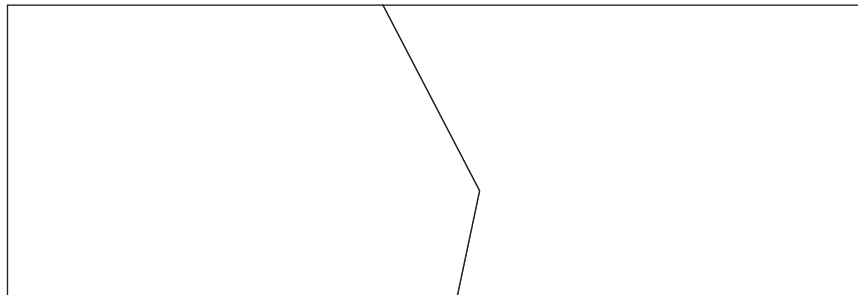
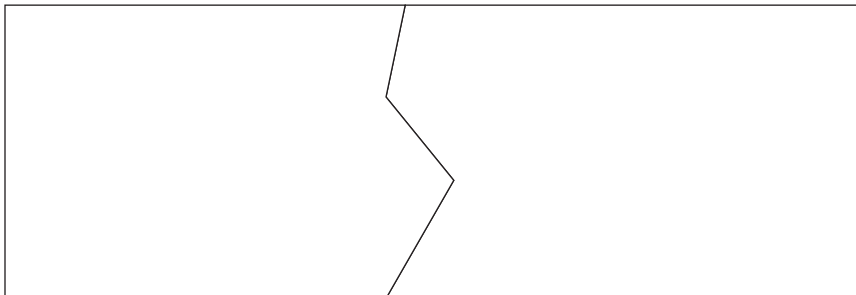
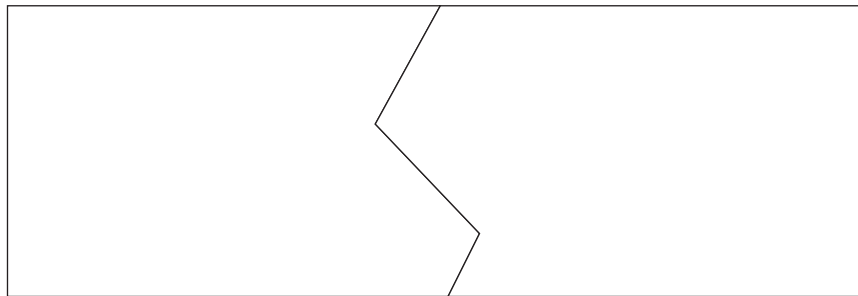
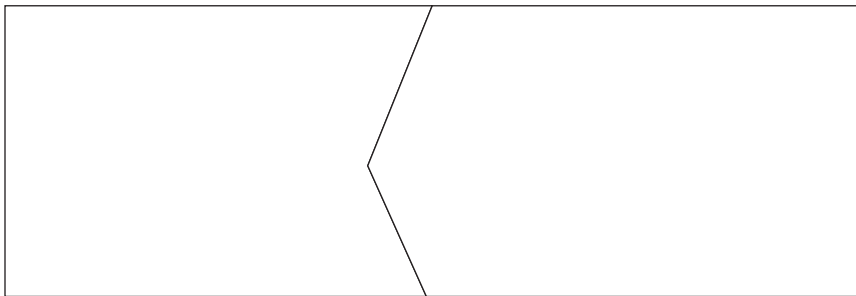
Ask children to put the pieces together to form a word, say the letter-sound for each puzzle piece, and then blend these letter-sounds quickly and smoothly aloud.

In first and second grades, if children's letter-by-letter blending is good, you can provide practice blending chunks within words by cutting up longer words into logical word parts. Have children say the word part for each piece, put the puzzle pieces together, and blend the parts quickly to read the whole word.



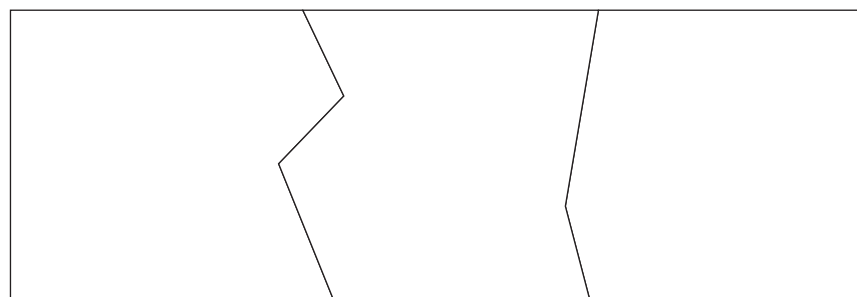
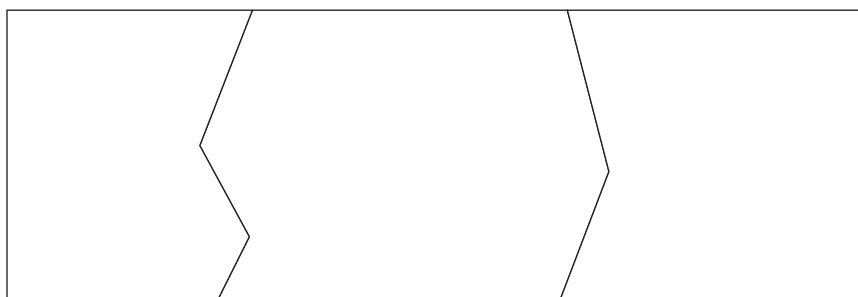
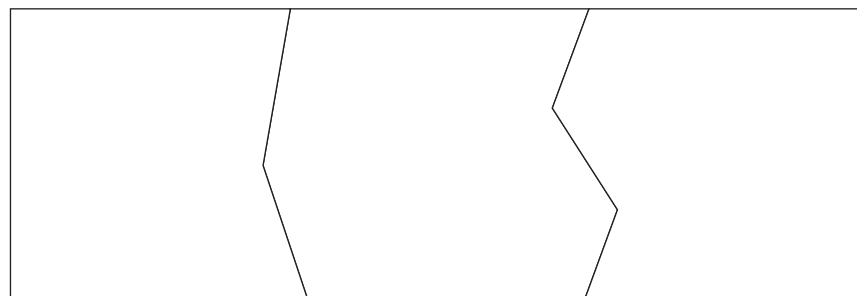
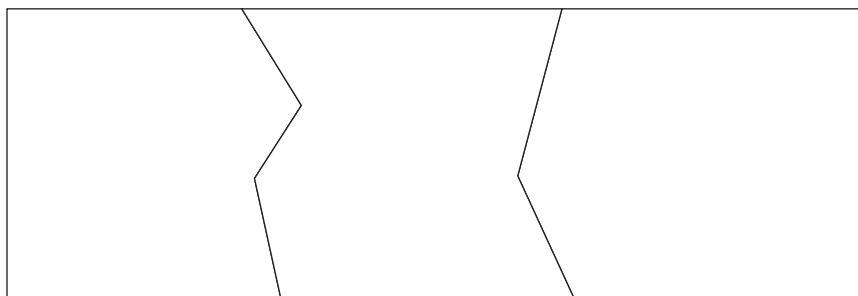
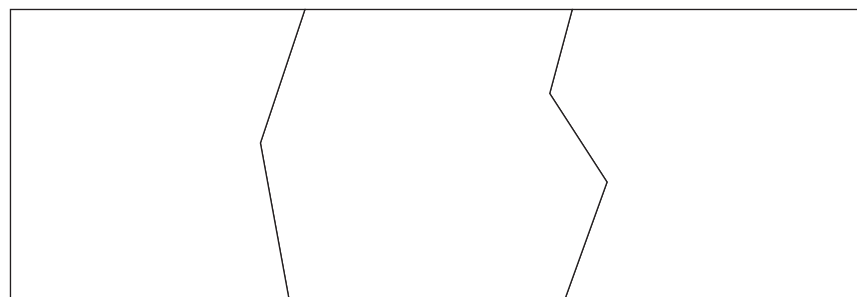
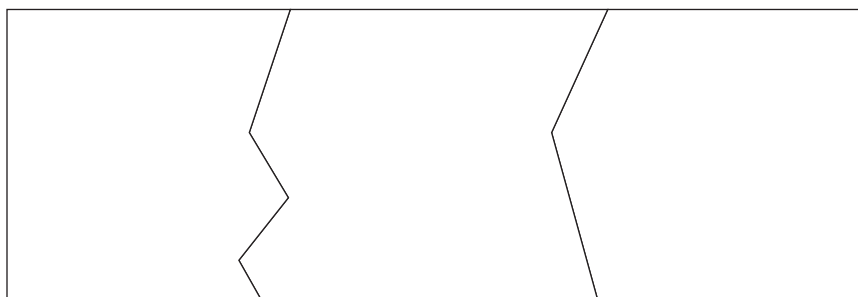
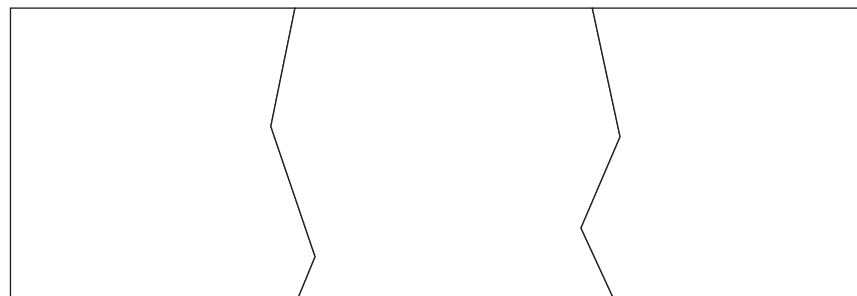

Words With Two Phonemes



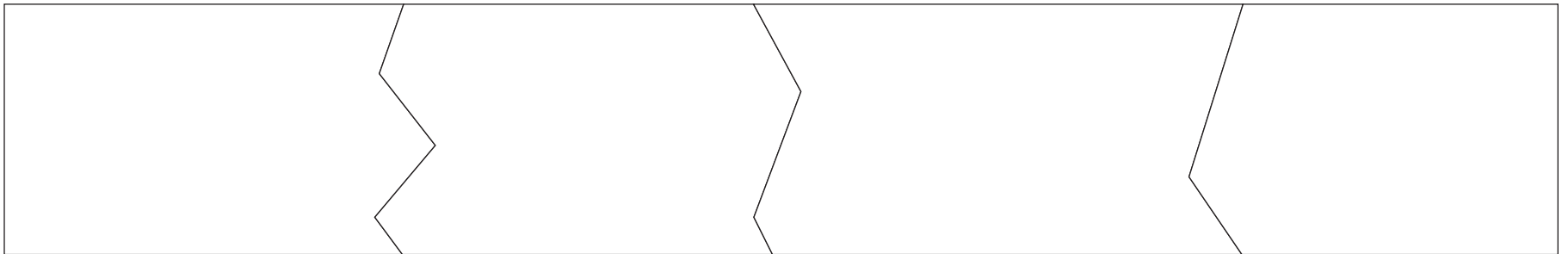
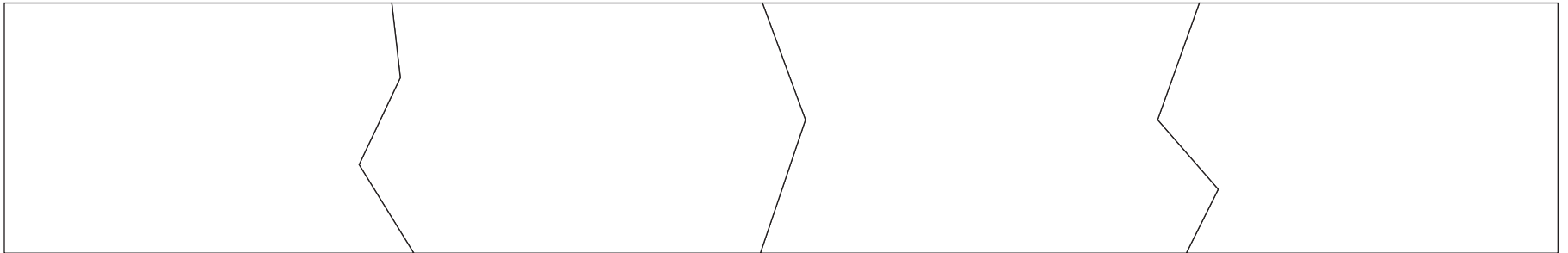
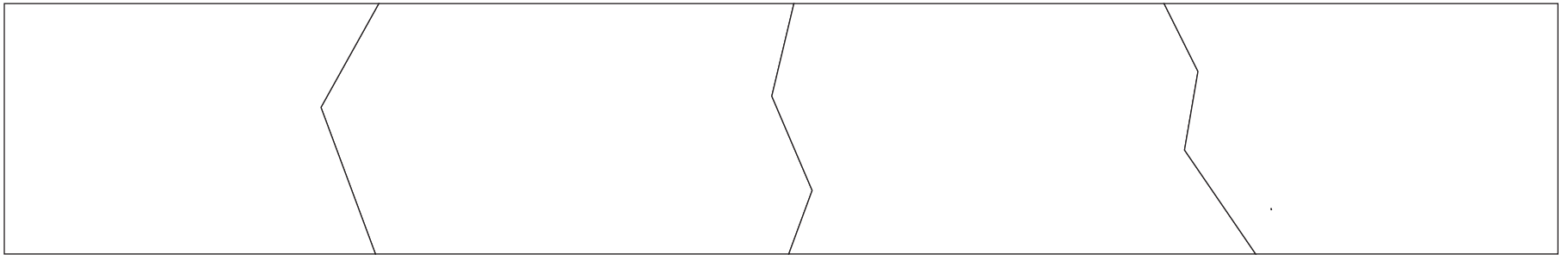
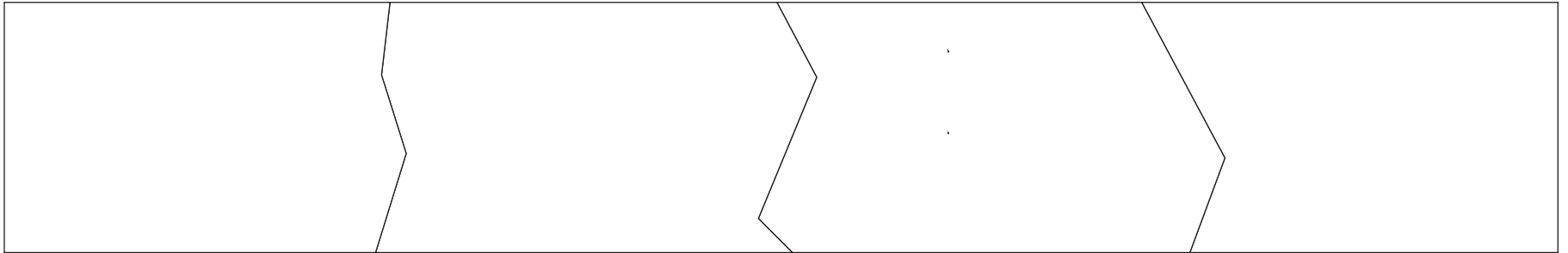

Words With Three Phonemes



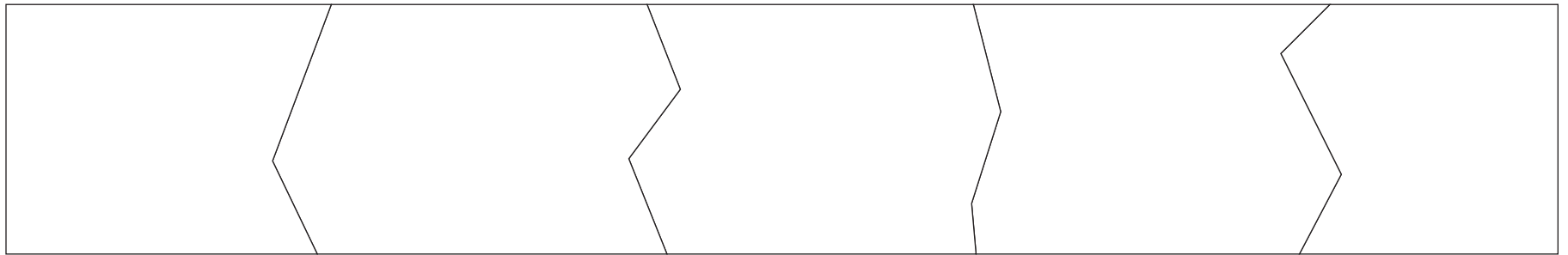
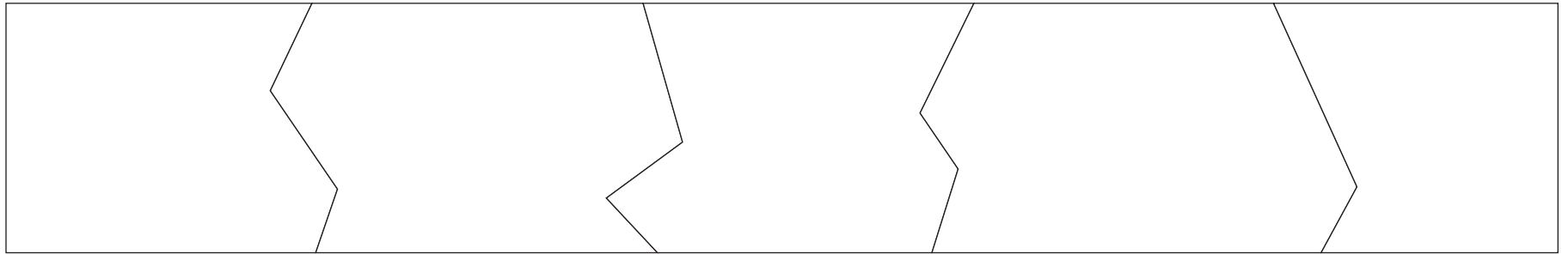
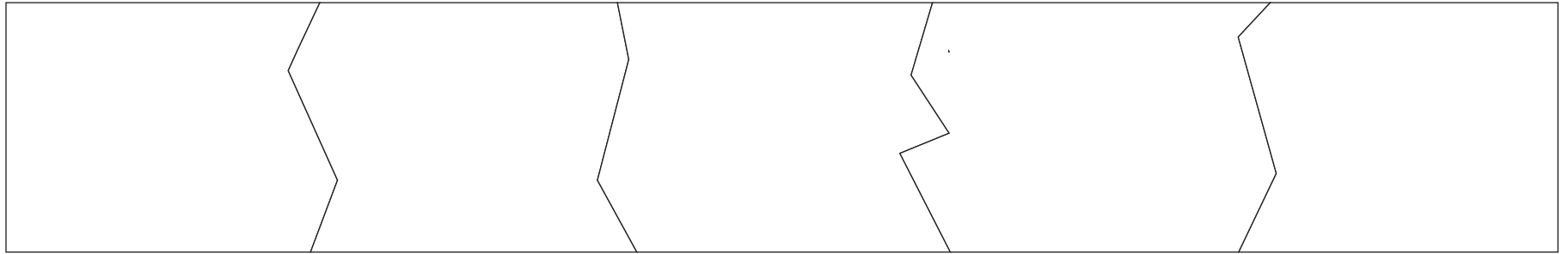
